




Draw-a-saurus Iguanodon

Lightly sketch step 1, then add the pink lines from step 2 on top of step 1. Keep adding the pink lines from each step until you reach step 8. Draw firmly over your final lines then colour your dinosaur.



Iguanodon had large thumb spikes, which might have been used for defence against predators, and long prehensile little fingers used to forage for food.

The Museums *Iguanodon* stands on its back legs however research in this department has shown this is not right. Look closely and you will see the hands and arms are very large and powerful and the claws on the 'hands' look just like the hooves on its 'feet'. Combined with fossil footprint evidence, this tell us *Iguanodon* walked on all four legs.
